

About Us

Renewable World Energies, LLC (RWE) was founded in March of 2012 with 17 hydroelectric plants located throughout the Midwest as a spinoff of an independent hydroelectric power producer co-founded by Bill Harris in the 1970's. RWE continues to acquire hydroelectric power plants from private companies, individuals and utilities with a goal of producing clean, renewable energy for generations to come.

Renewable World Energies, LLC owns, operates and maintains 20 hydroelectric power plants throughout Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa and Illinois.

As a steward of pristine woodlands and waterways, Renewable World Energies is a champion of sound conservation practices on the 3,000 acres of forestland and 38 miles of shoreline we own. Our vision is to make them available for generations to come, providing enjoyment and inspiring educational values, all while producing renewable clean energy.

Recreational Facilities

Renewable World Energies owns approximately 3,000 acres with over 38 miles of shoreline across the States of Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa and Illinois, which are open to the public.

In Michigan, RWE has four canoe portages, two boat landings, 33 campsites with picnic areas, a fishing pier, two sanitary facilities and public access to both fishing and hunting in addition to hiking and sightseeing.

In Wisconsin, RWE has twelve canoe portages, four boat landings, eight campsites, nine Adirondack Shelters, three fishing platforms, five sanitary facilities and public access to both fishing and hunting. RWE also owns a log cabin that sleeps 18 with indoor bathroom facilities. Renewable World Foundation uses the log cabin throughout the year for various camping and educational functions. The cabin is also used by the Boy Scouts for regional Boy Scout outings.
